There is a wide range of studies that discuss the relationship between society and space.

The courses given in the program are divided as applied and theoretical courses. The Urban Design Practices course is applied, while the other courses are carried out theoretically. Courses are offered in different areas such as urban spaces, city streets, coastal areas, urban morphology, application problems, urban design methods and techniques, neighbourhood design and sustainability. In order to complete the master's program, it is necessary to successfully complete the Course, Seminar and Thesis stages.
